

I've had the privilege to travel to Israel/Palestine twice. Once was with an ecumenical group of pastors enrolled in The Institute for Preaching and Pastoral Renewal through my seminary Alma Mater, Candler School of Theology at Emory University. The second time was with a group of UMC pastors from across our Conference, Western North Carolina. The second trip

was through the Reynolds Program for Leadership in Evangelism & Discipleship (LEAD). Each time, the difference between "sites" and "sights" was an important distinction. A "site" is the traditional place where crusaders from Europe in the 1000's visited and marked the places where Jesus walked. Over time, these places have drawn tourists to observe the potential actual places where Jesus healed, taught, walked. This is especially meaningful on the Via Dolorosa, "The Sorrowful Way." The Via is a walk through the old city of Jerusalem, following the Stations of the Cross. There are stops along the way where things happened to Jesus as he journeyed to the Mount of Calvary. There is one particular place where Jesus fell and braced himself against a wall to gain his balance.

People have placed their own handprints there over centuries. "Sights" are different. They are places or moments which might not have anything to do with traditional places. Instead, "sights" are experiences, feelings, touches of the holy in places that may not be traditional "sites" at all. This is an expansion of the location of "the Holy." The Holy isn't only located in "sites."



The Holy can be a "sight" anywhere, anytime. On the first trip I made to Israel/Palestine, I had a God "sighting" in the Chapel in the Garden of Gethsemane. On the second trip, it was at the down-stairs chapel rock wall, covered with plexiglass, at the base of the traditional site of the Mt. of Calvary, this sight is like a Christian "wailing wall." This month, be aware of "sightings" of the Holy. When we are alert and looking, which is one of the admonitions for Lent, who knows where and when we will find a God-sighting?!

Update on Flood Incident

Greetings and Blessings from the Board of Stewards as we travel through the Lent. During this sacred season, our hearts are filled with anticipation and reflection as the joy of Easter morning awaits us on the horizon as a beacon of hope.

We would like to update you about the significant updates and repairs following the flood incident on Sunday, November 19, 2023, facilitated by an insurance settlement.

Here's a breakdown of the Restoration process so far:

- Insurance Settlement: The church received \$103,000 from the insurance company to cover damages caused by the flood.
- Review and Dispute: Detailed review and questioning of the insurance quote were conducted with key stakeholders including Hannah DeLaRiva, Fred Cantler, Peter Johnson, Alan Pooser, Jane Wheeless, WCP Staff and Veranita Alvord to ensure accuracy and fairness in the assessment.
- **Flood Mitigation:** \$53,000 from the insurance settlement was paid to Service Master for flood mitigation services to address immediate damage control measures on the day of the flood and the weeks following.
- **Restoration Planning:** A step-by-step Restoration plan is being developed based on remaining insurance funds, with intentional strategic allocation of resources.
- **Bids and Contracts:** Bids were solicited from various businesses for Restoration work, with the final bids currently being received and evaluated.
- Hiring of Commercial Interior Designer: To assure proper and current trends in
 flooring and fixtures for churches and educational spaces, we have been in consultation
 with Claire Counts, Commercial Interior Designer, and owner of Rhythm Interiors and
 Installation. The benefit of working with Claire is that her company designs and installs,
 so she is our main point of contact from the beginning of the project to its completion.
- **Preventive Measures:** Automatic water shut-off systems have been ordered to prevent future incidents of flooding. This is mandated by the Insurance Company to help alleviate flooding problems in the future.
- · Weekday Children's Program (WCP) Hallway & Rooms:
 - Approval has been obtained for new LVT (Luxury Vinyl Tile) flooring in the WCP hallway and rooms. Installation is expected to be complete by the end of March.
 - Painting of the WCP rooms
- Youth Rooms:
 - Mold testing has been completed and necessary remediation measures have been taken.
 - Carpets have been cleaned.
 - Painting of Youth Rooms.
 - Selection of floor coverings for break-out rooms is in progress.
 - Furniture and other items have been ordered, with delivery expected during
 March
 - Other furnishings are also in the process of being acquired.
 - A donation list for games and other resources is being compiled to replace items ruined by water.

Overall, these updates and repairs demonstrate a comprehensive approach to Restoring the church premises following the flood, prioritizing both functionality and aesthetics across various areas of the facility.
