 - The team made many strong suggestions. Here are some :
 - "Rebirth" of a former group called the "Group of Eight" who organized contacts in the past. Involve the Prayer Group
 - Emphasize keeping the pastor in the loop
 - The team also suggested some candidates for participation and leadership, based on previous work of this kind

3. Discussion and Next Steps: (30-40 min)

a. Facilities and recap of Hendersonville UMC field trip in July 2025

- Jay Farrell: Orientation towards doing something with the facility was the strongest point & set the tone.
- Peter Johnson: Hendersonville UMC surveyed the church & Percent voted to utilize the church building more. It was very impressive to see the various projects that were completed
- The church had partnered with non-profits to finish the tasks
- The young adult space transformation was inspiring
- Churches aren't the places in society where people feel comfortable just "stopping by". It's a neat future to think about & we look forward to exploring the idea more.
- Hendersonville UMC is quite formal and structured in how they bring outside groups in.
- In Transylvania County, meeting spaces are hard to find. This is one area where we can fill a need. Ensuring all key pieces of what groups would want are available
- Hendersonville UMC has a multi use Chapel (Sunday school classes, small concerts, yoga). They have a dream kitchen with a cafe serving line. This took quite a long time, energy & money.
- Our additions to our space don't have to be fancy -
- With our church alarm app, we can lock and unlock doors remotely. This gives us flexibility of when & where we can host events.
- There was a clear goal for using each space it wasn't scattered. If we already know particular organizations that align with goals this would be a smart place to start. Potentially putting out a community survey? Engagement with the congregation asking about organizations with space needs? This provides clarity and structure.
- It's important to know our parameters & boundaries that we'd like to set when offering this service.
- **Update a facility user agreement to get approved by board
- Whatever room is being used has in depth information posted on how to use/leave it
- We have started this with the Sanctuary Counseling Group
- After the field trip, it is easy to
- Step one: community use inventory to see how many people are actually using this facility before moving forward



- Taking care of our space & paying attention to how we are using them
- Being good stewards of what we have

b. Property - Caldwell Street (Southern Roots)

- If we were to consider doing something, it can't just be a pipe dream or "future use" conversation. This is something we'd have to sell to the congregation. It's A LOT of money.
- This feels like a large project to think about. We have many things going on and we may not be at a stable enough position to move forward. Other opportunities will come up.
- We don't have a clear picture of how used this facility is. We don't need to move forward with purchasing something so expensive when we aren't fully utilizing our CURRENT space.
- There is way more maximization to do here before we try to tackle a complete other building.
- However we move forward we need to make sure the decision is sustainable.
- Should the price come down how far does the price have to come down for us to be interested?
- Housing doesn't really work... "If we are looking to support the community, yet end up having to tell someone to leave their home because they aren't able to pay..." That can become uncomfortable and an issue for the church
- This would be the gift that keeps on taking. Not a good idea. Period
- If we want to go towards an exploratory route there are many factors to consider.
- What could this space be?
 - Walk-up coffee shop (Deep Time Coffee, In-Depth thinking about WHO could work there)
 - Indian Restaurant
 - Brainstorming should be around the ministry first & in the context of what this church seeks to create
 - Childcare (specifically infant care)
 - Have a conversation with a community leader to help keep us focused on if there's a hole that needs to be filled or not
 - Speaking to the congregation for more insight/intell
